

Anticipated Outcomes

- To educate the public, teachers, consultants, and curriculum- and teacher-developers about the genocidal starvation of millions of Ukrainian peasants in 1932-1933
- To develop instructional materials (lesson plans, learning activities, print and audio-visual resources) on the genocidal Holodomor for the Alberta Social Studies Program of Studies
- To empower teachers with meaningful instructional approaches for covering the Holodomor topic
- To promote further education about the Holodomor

Scope

Based on newly released Soviet documents and KGB archives, the workshop will trace historical events and illustrate how the Holodomor that claimed millions of lives of Ukrainians was organized and covered up. The workshop will consist of the following components:

- background information on the Holodomor
- instructional materials (lesson plans, learning activities, audio-visual resources)
- instructional strategies based on the inquiry method that facilitate a better understanding of the topic.
