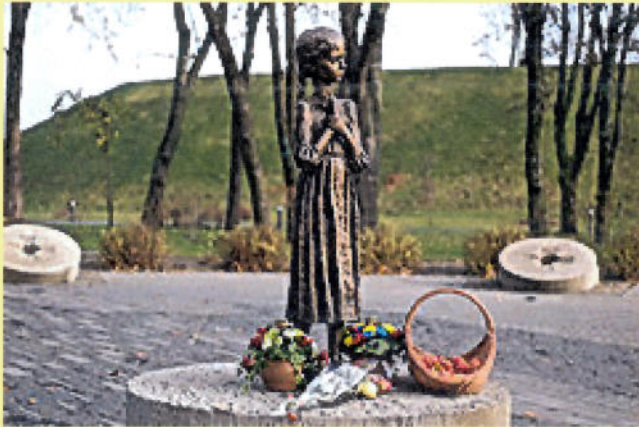

The **Holodomor Education Workshop** provides hands-on learning experiences, teaching strategies, resources, and background information about Holodomor 1932-1933 in Ukraine, as a way of teaching and learning about human rights and social justice issues.

The Holodomor genocide is a tragic event in world history in which an estimated 7 million people were starved to death.
