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Resilient Together

Three years ago, our Ukrainian Canadian community gathered in Winnipeg for the XXVII Triennial Congress. At that time, Russia's full-scale genocidal war against Ukraine had raged for 250 days.

None of us could have imagined that, three years later, this brutal war would continue to this day. In the 1,360 days since, Ukraine has endured unimaginable losses. Across every city, town, and village lie the graves of courageous heroes and innocent victims – sacred reminders of the price Ukrainians pay for freedom. There is not a single Ukrainian who has not been marked by the loss or injury of a loved one, a friend, or a neighbour.

After the horrors of Mariupol, Bucha, Izyum, and Olenivka were laid bare for the world to see, we believed that Canada and our Western allies would swiftly deliver the weapons and resources Ukraine needed to win.

Yet we have learned a painful truth: too many Western leaders feared Russia's defeat more than they desired Ukraine's victory. And now, even when there is will, the West remains unprepared to fulfill its promise to truly Stand With Ukraine. For years, Western capitals have hesitated and dithered – worrying that stronger action, harsher sanctions, or critical weapons might be seen as "escalation." But since Russia's invasion of Georgia in 2008, the world has seen clearly: it is not Western strength that provokes Moscow, but Western weakness. Restraint has not contained Russia's aggression; it has emboldened it.

Yet Ukraine remains unbroken. Ukrainians continue to fight – not because they wish to, but because they must.

- They fight so that no future generation of Ukrainians will live in chains.
- They fight to break free from centuries of Russian cultural, linguistic, and political domination.
- They fight to end Russia's genocidal war against Ukraine and Ukrainians.
- They fight for peace.

That Ukraine has held off a larger, better-armed, and ruthlessly cruel enemy is a testament to the courage, ingenuity, and resilience of its people. It is that same resilience that gives us absolute confidence in Ukraine's victory.

The road ahead will not be easy. But as Ukrainians grow ever more self-reliant on the battlefield, their innovation and resolve have captured the attention of NATO allies now facing Russia's provocations themselves. Ukraine is not only defending its own borders – it is defending the very principles of freedom and sovereignty that underpin global security. Ukraine stands defending Europe, Western civilization, the rule of law, the Free World.

Here in Canada, we too must remain united and resolute. Together, we will strengthen the bonds of our community and ensure that our leaders provide Ukraine with all the military, humanitarian, and financial support it needs. We must demand maximum pressure on Russia, unwavering assistance for displaced Ukrainians, and the courage from our leaders to finally learn the lessons of history – that hesitation in the face of tyranny endangers us all.

I am deeply proud of what our community has accomplished over these past three years. I extend my heartfelt thanks to our Board of Directors, Executive Committee, Committees, and member organizations, whose energy and devotion sustain our work every day.

My sincere gratitude also goes to the UCC Advisory Council, chaired by James Temerty, CM, for their invaluable wisdom and guidance, and to our dedicated staff, led by Ihor Michalchyshyn, whose tireless commitment inspires us all.

And finally – to you, our community leaders and volunteers – thank you. Your determination, unity, and love for Ukraine give strength to us all. It is your dedication that keeps us strong, that fuels our purpose, and that ensures we remain resilient together – now, for the next three years, and for generations to come.

Let us move forward – united, unyielding, and unwavering – until the day Ukraine stands free and victorious.

Разом — незламні

Три роки тому наша українсько-канадська громада зібралася у Вінніпезі на XXVII Трирічний Конгрес. Тоді повномасштабна геноцидна війна Росії проти України тривала вже 250 днів.

Ніхто з нас не міг уявити, що через три роки ця жорстока війна триватиме й досі. За ці 1360 днів Україна зазнала жахливих втрат. У кожному місті, містечку та селі знаходяться могили відважних героїв і невинних жертв — священні нагадування про ціну, яку українці платять за свободу. Немає жодного українця, якого б не торкнулася втрата чи поранення близьких, друзів або сусідів.

Після жахів Маріуполя, Бучі, Ізюма та Оленівки, які бачив цілий світ, ми вірили, що Канада та наші західні союзники швидко нададуть Україні зброю та ресурси, необхідні для перемоги.

Та ми засвоїли болісну істину: занадто багато західних лідерів більше бояться поразки Росії, ніж прагнуть перемоги України. І навіть зараз, коли з'явилася політична воля, Захід залишається невідготовленим, аби посправжньому виконати свою обіцянку стояти поруч з Україною.

Західні столиці роками вагалися, побоюючись, що рішучі дії, жорсткі санкції чи надання критично важливого озброєння можуть бути сприйняті як «ескалація». Але з часу російського вторгнення до Грузії у 2008 році світ чітко побачив: Москву провокує не сила Заходу, а його слабкість. Стриманість не зупинила російську агресію — вона лише надала їй сміливості.

І все ж Україна залишається незламною. Українці продовжують боротися — не тому, що цього хочуть, а тому, що мусять.

- Вони борються, щоб майбутні покоління українців не жили в кайданах.
- Вони борються за звільнення від багатовікового російського культурного, мовного та політичного панування.
- Вони борються, щоб покласти край геноцидній війні Росії проти України та українців.
- Вони борються за мир.

Те, що Україна втримала натиск значно численнішого, краще озброєного й безжального ворога, є свідченням мужності, винахідливості та стійкості українців. Саме ця незламність дає нам абсолютну впевненість у перемозі України.

Шлях, що лежить попереду, не буде легким. Але, стаючи дедалі самостійнішою на полі бою, Україна своїми інноваціями та рішучістю привертає увагу союзників по НАТО, які тепер самі стикаються з російськими провокаціями. Україна захищає не лише свої кордони — вона боронить самі засади свободи та суверенітету, на яких тримається світова безпека. Україна стоїть на захисті Європи, Західної Цивілізації, верховенства права та Вільного Світу.

Тут, у Канаді, ми також маємо залишатися єдиними й рішучими. Разом ми зміцнимо єдність нашої громади та забезпечимо, щоб наші лідери надавали Україні всю необхідну військову, гуманітарну та фінансову підтримку. Ми повинні вимагати максимального тиску на Росію, безперервної допомоги для вимушено переселених українців і мужності від наших лідерів, щоб вони нарешті засвоїли уроки історії — що вагання перед обличчям тиранії ставить під загрозу всіх нас.

Я глибоко пишаюся тим, чого наша громада досягла за ці три роки. Висловлюю щиру подяку Раді директорів, Екзекутивному комітету, Комітетам та членським організаціям, чия енергія й відданість щодня підтримують нашу спільну працю.

Особливу подяку висловлюю Дорадчій раді Конгресу на чолі з Костянтином Темертеєм, за їхню мудрість і поради, а також нашому відданому персоналу під керівництвом Ігора Михальчишина, чия невтомна праця надихає нас усіх.

І нарешті — вам, нашим громадським лідерам і волонтерам, — дякую. Ваша рішучість, єдність і любов до України додають нам усім сил. Саме ваша відданість робить нас сильними, надихає нас на досягнення наших цілей і гарантує, що ми разом залишимося стійкими — зараз, протягом наступних трьох років і для майбутніх поколінь.

Йдемо вперед — єдині, непохитні та незламні — до дня, коли Україна стоятиме вільною й переможною.

Message du Présidente

Résilient ensemble

Il y a trois ans, notre communauté canadienne-ukrainienne s'est réunie à Winnipeg pour le XXVII^e Congrès triennal. À ce moment-là, la guerre génocidaire à grande échelle menée par la Russie contre l'Ukraine faisait rage depuis 250 jours.

Personne d'entre nous n'aurait pu imaginer que, trois ans plus tard, cette guerre brutale continuerait encore aujourd'hui. Au cours des derniers 1 360 jours, l'Ukraine subi des pertes inimaginables. Dans chaque ville, village et localité reposent les tombes de héros courageux et de victimes innocentes – des rappels sacrés du prix que les Ukrainiens paient pour la liberté. Il n'existe pas un seul Ukrainien qui n'ait pas été marqué par la perte ou la blessure d'un être cher, d'un ami ou d'un voisin.

Après que les horreurs de Mariupol, Bucha, Izioum et Olenivka ont été révélées au monde entier, nous avons cru que le Canada et nos alliés occidentaux allaient rapidement fournir à l'Ukraine les armes et les ressources nécessaires pour vaincre.

Pourtant, nous avons appris une vérité douloureuse : trop de dirigeants occidentaux ont craint la défaite de la Russie plus qu'ils n'ont souhaité la victoire de l'Ukraine. Et aujourd'hui encore, même lorsqu'il y a de la volonté, l'Occident demeure mal préparé à tenir sa promesse de véritablement Soutenir l'Ukraine.

Pendant des années, les capitales occidentales ont hésité et tergiversé – craignant que des actions plus fortes, des sanctions plus sévères ou des armes cruciales ne soient perçues comme une « escalade ». Mais depuis l'invasion de la Géorgie par la Russie en 2008, le monde a pu constater clairement : ce n'est pas la force de l'Occident qui provoque Moscou, mais sa faiblesse. La retenue n'a pas contenu l'agression russe ; elle l'a encouragée.

Et pourtant, l'Ukraine reste invaincue. Les Ukrainiens continuent de se battre – non pas parce qu'ils le souhaitent, mais parce qu'ils le doivent.

Ils se battent pour qu'aucune génération future d'Ukrainiens ne vive enchaînée.

Ils se battent pour se libérer de siècles de domination culturelle, linguistique et politique russe.

Ils se battent pour mettre fin à la guerre génocidaire de la Russie contre l'Ukraine et les Ukrainiens.

Ils se battent pour la paix.

Que l'Ukraine ait réussi à résister à un ennemi plus grand, mieux armé et d'une cruauté impitoyable témoigne du courage, de l'ingéniosité et de la résilience de son peuple. C'est cette même résilience qui nous donne une confiance absolue en la victoire de l'Ukraine.

La route à venir ne sera pas facile. Mais pendant que les Ukrainiens deviennent plus autonomes sur le champ de bataille, leur innovation et leur détermination attirent l'attention des alliés de l'OTAN, désormais eux-mêmes confrontés aux provocations de la Russie. L'Ukraine ne défend pas seulement ses propres frontières – elle défend les principes mêmes de liberté et de souveraineté qui sous-tendent la sécurité mondiale. L'Ukraine se tient en défense de l'Europe, de la civilisation occidentale, de l'état de droit et du monde libre.

Ici, au Canada, nous devons nous aussi rester unis et résolus. Ensemble, nous renforcerons les liens de notre communauté et veillerons à ce que nos dirigeants fournissent à l'Ukraine tout le soutien militaire, humanitaire et financier dont elle a besoin. Nous devons exiger une pression maximale sur la Russie, une aide indéfectible pour les Ukrainiens déplacés, et le courage de nos dirigeants à enfin tirer les leçons de l'histoire – car l'hésitation face à la tyrannie nous met tous en danger.

Je suis profondément fier de ce que notre communauté a accompli au cours de ces trois dernières années. J'exprime ma gratitude sincère à notre conseil d'administration, à notre comité exécutif, à nos comités et à nos organisations membres, dont l'énergie et le dévouement soutiennent notre travail chaque jour.

Ma reconnaissance va également au Conseil consultatif du CUC, présidé par James Temerty, CM, pour sa sagesse et ses conseils inestimables, ainsi qu'à notre personnel dévoué, dirigé par Ihor Michalchyshyn, dont l'engagement infatigable nous inspire tous.

Et enfin – à vous, nos dirigeants communautaires et bénévoles – merci. Votre détermination, votre unité et votre amour pour l'Ukraine nous donnent à tous de la force. C'est votre dévouement qui nous maintient forts, qui alimente notre mission et qui garantit que nous restons résilients ensemble – aujourd'hui, pour les trois prochaines années, et pour les générations à venir.

Avançons ensemble – unis, inébranlables et déterminés – jusqu'au jour où l'Ukraine sera libre et victorieuse.

The Ukrainian Canadian Congress financial position remained solid in fiscal 2025. Revenues consist of donations, grants and program contributions.

Revenues in 2025 were \$376,667, up from 2022 revenues of \$347,000 due primarily to additional programs undertaken. A Newcomer Survey was developed for UCC C & E Trust with the support of the Canada Ukraine Foundation. Over 4,200 newcomers from across Canada participated, making this the largest study of its kind. The survey provides a comprehensive picture of Ukrainians who have arrived in Canada since 2015, including those who fled following Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.



Since our last Triennial Congress in 2022, net assets over the 3-year period decreased from \$248K to \$120K due to losses in 2023 and 2024 totalling \$115K as a result of a decrease in revenues across the board. We have taken measures in 2025 to solicit donations and contributions resulting in revenues surpassing the 2022 level. During the 3 year period our expenses rose primarily due to programs for displaced ukrainians in Canada, advocacy for supporting Ukraine and expenses for crisis management.

The financial statements of Ukrainian Canadian Congress for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, have been audited by the Exchange Group. They have also been reviewed and recommended for approval by the UCC's Audit Committee, which took place at the October 7, 2025 Board of Directors meeting. They have been made available to Member Organizations subsequently.

Highlights of Activities and Accomplishments 2022-2025

The Ukrainian Canadian Congress (UCC) is the voice of Canada's Ukrainian community. The Congress brings together under one umbrella all the national, provincial and local Ukrainian Canadian organizations. Together with its member organizations, the UCC has been leading, coordinating and representing the interests of one of Canada's largest ethnic communities (1.4 million) since 1940 and has been instrumental in shaping Canada's social, economic and political landscape.

Three Pillars of our Work

- Supporting Ukraine
- Celebrating and Advancing our Ukrainian Canadian Identity
- Growing our Community

The following are highlights of UCC's activities since the last Triennial Congress held in Winnipeg in 2022.

Supporting Ukraine and #StandWithUkraine

Since Russia launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022, the Ukrainian Canadian Congress (UCC) has focused on supporting Ukraine and the Ukrainian people in the courageous defence of their homeland from Russia's genocidal aggression.

In early 2022, planning began on the #StandWithUkraine campaign, including work with community leaders on a national public advocacy campaign. Rallies, demonstrations and public shows of support for Ukraine were held regularly across the country. From coast to coast to coast, Canadians demonstrated their support for the Ukrainian people. The UCC expresses its deep gratitude to all organizers and participants.

UCC National regularly issued and coordinated Calls to Action, developed policy recommendations and advocated to Government and policymakers on the importance of supporting Ukraine and isolating Russia.

The UCC's policy recommendations evolved as the situation dictated. We provided real-time advice on the most effective way to counter Russian aggression and support Ukraine's victory.

As of October 2025, the policy recommendations are that Canada and allies:

Defence

- Increase military assistance to Ukraine beyond the \$2 billion earmarked for this year;
- Substantially increase investment in joint Ukrainian-Canadian defence production;

Economy

- Increase support for the Canadian private sector that seeks to invest in Ukraine;
- Invest in domestic energy production and pipelines to export Canadian energy to markets relying on Russian oil and gas so that Canada's economy grows and Russia's war machine is deprived of revenue.

#STANDWITHUKRAINE

Justice

- Designate Russia a state supporter of terrorism;
- Substantially increase sanctions on Russia and Russia's shadow fleet which evades sanctions and continues to transport Russian oil and gas to international markets;
- Support an international tribunal to hold Russia accountable for the crime of aggression, genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity;
- Use the \$300 billion in frozen Russian assets held in the West to aid Ukraine.

The UCC develops regular speaking points that are distributed to the UCC leadership and a wide range of community representatives and activists to ensure a coordinated community message.

Representatives of the UCC regularly speak to media and news programs and publish op-eds in national and local newspapers.

Representatives of the UCC also testify at Parliamentary Committees such as the Foreign Affairs, International Development, Public Safety, National Defence and International Trade Committees.

The UCC regularly develops and presents Briefing Notes to Members of Parliament, Senators, Ministers, Shadow Ministers and Government officials. These briefs are available publicly on the UCC website.

The work of the UCC, local organizations and community activists across the country has an important impact in ensuring that Canada continues to support Ukraine.

As of October 2025 the Government of Canada has committed:

- \$12.3 billion in financial assistance to Ukraine, including loan resources through the IMF and in direct bilateral loans;
- \$6.5 billion in military assistance;
- \$372.2 million in humanitarian assistance;
- \$700 million in development assistance funding;
- \$225 million in security and stabilization support.

Canada has also significantly increased sanctions on Russia and is playing a leading role in developing plans to use Russian assets frozen in Western institutions to benefit Ukraine.

The Modernization of the Canada-Ukraine Free Trade Agreement received Royal Assent in March 2024. UCC National President Alexandra Chyczij participated in a trade mission to Ukraine led by the Honourable Mary Ng, Minister of International Trade, in July 2024.

The UCC welcomes the assistance provided by Canada to Ukraine and the sanctions Canada has imposed on Russia to date. The UCC will continue to call for further Canadian support to ensure Ukraine's victory.

Advocacy Day 2024

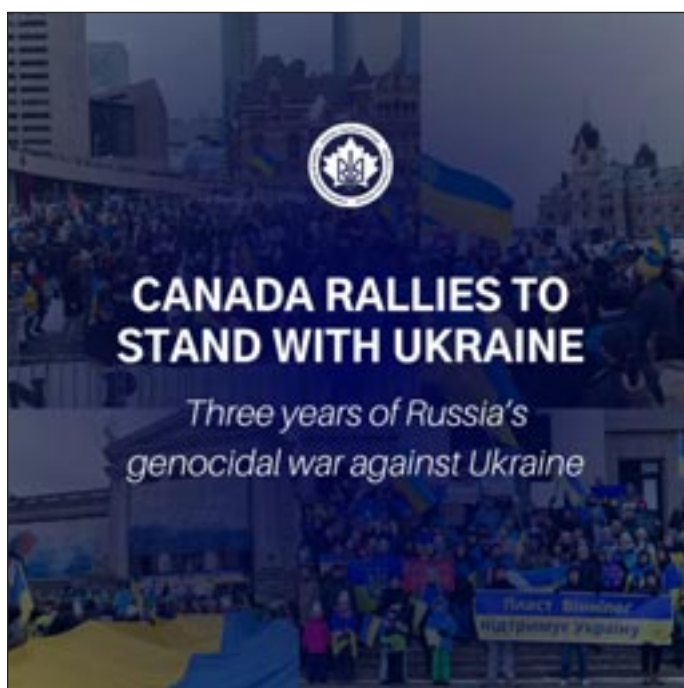
On October 21, 2024, delegates representing Ukrainian organizations from across Canada participated in Ukrainian Canadian Congress Advocacy Day on Parliament Hill.

UCC delegations met with over 50 Members of Parliament and Senators. The UCC advocated for Canadian support for Ukrainian victory, which requires increased military and economic support for Ukraine, a stronger response to Russia's genocidal war against Ukraine, and continued support for Ukrainian displaced persons.



Stand with Ukraine Demonstrations – Anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion

On the first anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, demonstrations in support of Ukraine were held in 54 communities across the country; on the second anniversary in 2024, demonstrations were held in over 40 communities, and on the third anniversary in 2025 demonstrations were held in 49 communities.

UCC–CUF Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal

A joint initiative of the UCC and the Canada-Ukraine Foundation (CUF), the Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal (UHA) was launched in January 2022 to coordinate the delivery of humanitarian aid in response to Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

The UHA's efforts focus on supporting displaced persons, medical care, emergency shelter, and food security—both in Ukraine and among those displaced to Europe and Canada. UHA has delivered over \$95 million in aid to more than 6 million people.



Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel

The Canada Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET) program allowed Ukrainians to come to Canada with temporary resident status and open work permits.

The CUAET visa allows Ukrainians, their spouses and dependent children to enter and leave Canada during a ten-year period, staying in Canada for a maximum of three years at a time.

By the end of the CUAET program on March 31, 2024, approximately 300,000 Ukrainians had arrived in Canada under the program. Best estimates are that less than one half of the arrivals remain in Canada.

In February of 2025 the government of Canada announced that CUAET visa holders who were in Canada on or before March 31, 2024 were eligible to apply for extensions to their work and study permits. The deadline to apply for extensions is March 31, 2026.

The UCC has recommended that pursuant to the discretion granted to the Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, the Minister approve a Temporary Public Policy (TPP) Pathway for Permanent Residence for Ukrainian citizens who are in Canada under a CUAET visa.

The UCC has further recommended that the Minister increase the number of provincial nominee allocations across Canada. This would allow provincial governments to develop streams designed to meet specific economic labour requirements. UCC encourages our provincial councils to work with their respective Premiers to maximize opportunities for Ukrainians displaced by Russia's war.

As of October, 2025 discussions between the UCC and the Department are ongoing.

President Zelenskyy visits Canada

In September 2023, President Zelenskyy visited Canada. He addressed Canada's Parliament, met with business leaders and, together with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, held an event with Canadians, including many members of the Ukrainian Canadian community, in Toronto. UCC National President Alexandra Chyczij met with President Zelenskyy and Prime Minister Trudeau.

Canada's G7 Presidency – UCC meets with President Zelenskyy

In June 2025, a delegation of the UCC led by Alexandra Chyczij, UCC National President, met with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on the margins of the G7 Leaders Summit.

The UCC delegation stressed to President Zelenskyy that our community will keep doing all in our power to ensure that our Government strongly supports Ukraine and increases pressure on Russia.

Prior to the G7 Summit, Chyczij concluded a visit to Ottawa, where she held meetings with several newly-appointed Cabinet Ministers.

Team Ukraine at Invictus Games Vancouver-Whistler

The UCC was honoured to support Team Ukraine and veterans from 25 competing nations at the Invictus Games, which were held in Vancouver and Whistler, British Columbia from February 8–16, 2025. Thirty-five veterans from Ukraine, who suffered physical and psychological wounds heroically defending Ukraine from Russia's genocidal war of aggression, participated in the Games.

The UCC is grateful to the Temerty Foundation and the Canada-Ukraine Foundation for their partnership with the UCC Charitable and Educational Trust in supporting Team Ukraine's training camp in BC.

On February 7, the Ukrainian community in British Columbia welcomed Team Ukraine and their families at the Invictus Team Ukraine Charity Gala Night at the Seaforth Armoury in Vancouver, the home of the Seaforth Highlanders of Canada.

Bill S-210 – An Act respecting Ukrainian Heritage Month

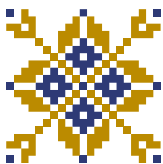
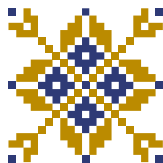
On October 1, 2025, Bill S-210, An Act respecting Ukrainian Heritage Month, was passed by the Senate. The Bill, introduced by Senator Stan Kutcher, will establish September as Ukrainian Heritage Month in Canada.

The UCC thanks Senator Kutcher for introducing the Bill and applauds its adoption by the Senate. As of October 2025, the Bill is being considered in the House of Commons. The UCC has called on the House to swiftly adopt Bill S-210.



Vyshyvanka Day

Every year in May, Ukrainians across the country together with friends of Ukraine participate in Vyshyvanka Day celebrations. Dozens of events are held from coast to coast. Canadian Members of Parliament, Senators and Members of Provincial Legislative Assemblies and Municipal governments participate in this annual celebration.

Commemorative Events and Campaigns

Holodomor Commemoration, Awareness and Education

Every year the Ukrainian Canadian community commemorates the Holodomor with a series of local commemorative events and activities.

The UCC Holodomor Awareness Committee oversees UCC's programming during National Holodomor Awareness Week. Through the UCC Holodomor Education Committee, the UCC participates in organizing regular teachers' and educators' conferences focusing on Holodomor education.



In November 2023 the world commemorated the 90th anniversary of the Holodomor. Events were held across Canada and on Parliament Hill, and the Awareness Committee organized the Shine a Light campaign.

The Holodomor National Awareness Tour – Holodomor Mobile Classroom, a joint project of the Canada-Ukraine Foundation, the Ukrainian Canadian Research and Documentation Centre and the Holodomor Research and Education Consortium – continues to tour Canada to raise awareness and educate Canadians about the Holodomor.

Holodomor Remembrance Day in Schools takes place in mid-April every year.

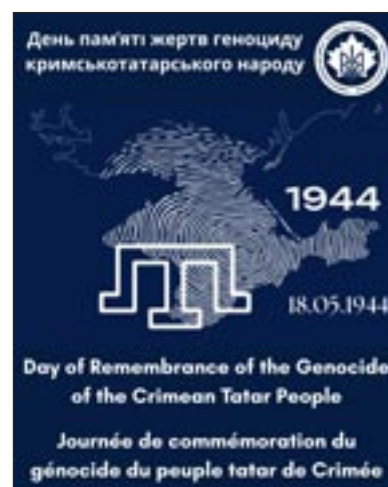
Crimean Tatar Genocide Recognition, Commemoration

In 1944, the totalitarian Soviet communist regime exiled the Crimean Tatar People, the Indigenous People of Crimea, from their homeland. Hundreds of thousands of men, women and children were forcibly and violently deported to Siberia and the Central Asian regions of the USSR. Nearly half lost their lives during the first year of exile. The Soviet regime prohibited the Crimean Tatar People from returning to Crimea for almost 50 years.

Russia invaded Crimea in 2014. Today, the Crimean Tatar People are bravely resisting the Russian occupation of their ancestral homeland. The Crimean Tatar People are once again subject to systemic repression and attacks on their inalienable rights and freedoms by the Russian occupation regime.

The UCC advocated for the recognition by Canada of the 1944 deportation of the Crimean Tatar People – the Sürgünlik – as an act of genocide.

In 2022, Canada recognized the 1944 Soviet deportation of the Crimean Tatar People as an act of genocide and established May 18 as Crimean Tatar Genocide Memorial Day. In 2024, the world commemorated the 80th anniversary of the Sürgünlik.



Highlights of Activities and Accomplishments 2022-2025

Canada's First National Internment Operations

Thousands of people of Ukrainian and Eastern European descent were interned across Canada during the Canada's First National Internment Operations from 1914-1920.

These people were interned not for something they had done but simply because of where they had come from. The internment operations were a gross infringement on the civil liberties of its citizens and immigrants to Canada.

In 2014, the Endowment Council of the Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund and the UCC Internment Committee adopted resolutions designating October 28 as National Internment Commemoration Day in Canada.

In 2022 the UCC conducted the Internment Education Campaign, which reached hundreds of thousands of viewers on social media. The campaign promoted awareness of First World War Internment Operations using a series of innovative video ads and still images featured on social media and with BellMedia partners (CTV News, TSN, Discovery Channel, etc). This campaign was supported by the Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund.

In 2024, the UCC Internment Committee expanded its internment education campaign, encouraging the use of online resources to reach both elementary and secondary students.

These resources align with Canadian curriculum standards and include lessons, documents videos and more. The resources are available on UCC's website



Ukrainian Canadian Sacrifice Medal

Established by a Resolution of the XXVII Triennial Congress of Ukrainian Canadians in Winnipeg in 2022, the Ukrainian Canadian Sacrifice Medal honours Canadian citizens who have been Killed in Action, Wounded in Action or are Missing in Action, presumed deceased, and were serving with Ukraine's Armed Forces in defence of Ukraine's freedom against Russia's genocidal war.

A joint initiative of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress and the Ukrainian War Veterans Association, the Ukrainian Canadian Sacrifice Medal honours the bravery and valour of Canadians who have heroically given their lives or have been wounded in battle for Ukraine's freedom. Generations of Canadians have courageously defended freedom against tyranny and today, many continue that tradition in Ukraine. We are forever grateful for their service.

As of November 2025, the Sacrifice Medal has been bestowed on fourteen Canadians who have been Killed in Action or are Missing in Action, presumed deceased. These heroes are:

Highlights of Activities and Accomplishments 2022–2025

Growing our Community

Protecting Our community

Since the launch of Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, the Ukrainian Canadian community has been subjected to increasing attack. In June 2023, the UCC launched the Community Safety survey to gauge the frequency and severity of threats to the safety and well-being of Ukrainian Canadian communities and supporters of Ukraine across Canada.

The Survey drew 1,062 respondents from across the country and all provinces. The number of respondents experiencing hate-motivated incidents related to their support for Ukraine or their Ukrainian identity has risen dramatically.

Before February 2022 one in three (29%) respondents experienced hate-motivated incidents. Since the start of Russia's full-scale invasion in February 2022 the number increased to one in two (48.8%). This represents an increase of over 70%.



The UCC made the results of this Survey available to Government Ministers and the Department of Public Safety; the House of Commons Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security; Public Inquiry into Foreign Interference in Federal Electoral Processes and Democratic Institutions; law enforcement, and relevant government agencies.

The UCC Community Safety Committee – composed of volunteers with backgrounds in law enforcement – collected tools and resources to assist newcomers and Ukrainians in Canada. These have been distributed widely and are available on the UCC's website.

The UCC was granted Party standing at the Public Inquiry into Foreign Interference in the Federal Electoral Processes and Democratic Institutions, presided over by Commissioner Justice Marie-Josée Hogue. The Inquiry began in late 2023 and concluded in January 2025. Donald Bayne and Jon Doody of Bayne Sellar Ertel Macrae represented the UCC at the Inquiry.

The UCC presented evidence to the Commission, gave testimony, questioned witnesses and communicated forcefully to the Commission the serious threat that our community, and Canadian society as a whole, faces from Russia's campaign to undermine our democracy.

While Commissioner Hogue correctly identified Russia as one of the countries threatening Canadian democracy, among her 51 recommendations, there were none that, even if implemented, would adequately address this threat. It is disappointing that Russia will remain undeterred from its threatening activities in Canada.

On October 1, UCC National President Alexandra Chyczij testified at the House of Commons Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security, which held hearings in the wake of revelations that Canadian companies and individuals are involved in a Russian disinformation influence conspiracy run by RT employees.

Testifying at the SECU Committee, Chyczij presented the Ukrainian Canadian community's recommendations on actions the Canadian government should take to respond to Russia's interference and disinformation campaigns in Canada.

On October 2, Chyczij testified at the Public Inquiry into Foreign Interference.

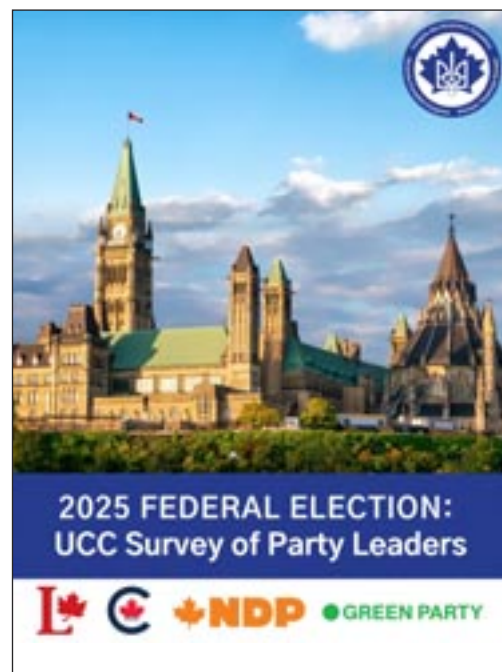
2025 Federal Election

The 2025 Canadian Federal Election took place on April 28, 2025. Prior to the Election, the UCC launched its National Policy Guide, which included five key policy priorities:

1. Canadian security and defence
2. Canadian and global energy security
3. Supporting Ukraine's defence
4. Isolating and holding Russia to account
5. Assisting Displaced Ukrainians.

The UCC also developed the UCC Federal Elections Guide, to assist our community in making informed choices when casting their ballots. The Guide encouraged our community to get involved in the election.

During the election campaign the UCC surveyed the leaders of Canada's national political parties regarding their positions on issues of importance to our community. The results of the 2025 Survey of Federal Party Leaders were published and made available to our community, the public and media.



Ukrainian Newcomer Survey 2025

In partnership with the Canada-Ukraine Foundation (CUF), the UCC conducted the Ukrainian Newcomer Survey 2025.

The survey was conducted online from May to July 2025, and was open to individuals aged 18 and older who identify as Ukrainian or Ukrainian Canadian, arrived in Canada within the past ten years, and currently reside in Canada.

Over 4,200 newcomers from across Canada participated in the survey, making this the largest study of its kind. The survey provides a comprehensive picture of Ukrainians who have arrived in Canada since 2015, including those who fled following Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.

The survey questionnaire included approximately 45 questions addressing several themes designed to meet the following key objectives:

- Understand how Ukrainian newcomers engage with Ukrainian Canadian community organizations and activities
- Identify programs, services, and supports that newcomers consider most valuable
- Document challenges and barriers that newcomers face while settling in Canada
- Provide insights on how community organizations can improve outreach and delivery of services
- Enable comparisons with established Ukrainian Canadian populations, through questions adapted from the 2021 UCC Community Survey

The Survey results and analysis – including findings and recommendations by the Metropolis Institute – are publicly available on the UCC's website.



Highlights of Activities and Accomplishments 2022-2025

Youth Ambassadors Program

Established in 2024, the UCC Youth Ambassador Program is an eight month-long youth leadership program that aims to foster emerging leaders' skills, policy awareness, cultural understanding, and empowers them to undertake projects and initiatives to address local community needs.

Throughout the program's duration, youth ambassadors organized and actively participated in a variety of events and projects with a focus on

- Leadership
- Skills and Competencies
- Peer Networking and Engagement
- Community Engagement



National Education Council

The UCC National Education Council organized a National Conference for Ukrainian Educators in May 2025 in Toronto. The conference gathered Ukrainian educators from across the country to share strategies, resources, and best practices in heritage education.

The event included keynote presentations, panel discussions, and practical workshops focused on curriculum development, bilingual education, and cultural engagement. Participants emphasized the importance of supporting the next generation through modern tools while preserving Ukrainian identity.

In May 2024, the National Conference for Ukrainian Educators was held in a hybrid in-person/online format, bringing together educators across Canada and offering valuable discussions on modern teaching methodologies, technological advancements, and effective strategies.

New Branches

We are delighted that five new branches have joined the UCC since the last Triennial Congress: Prince Edward Island, the Ukrainian Association of Fredericton, New Brunswick; the Ukrainian Cultural Organization of Newfoundland and Labrador; Waterloo-Wellington, Ontario; and the Ukrainian Canadian Association of Yukon. Highlights of Activities and Accomplishments 2022-2025

Parliamentary Internship Program



Re-established in 2017 by the UCC Charitable and Educational Trust, the UCC Parliamentary Internship Program provides recent Ukrainian Canadian graduates with the opportunity to gain valuable political and professional experience to launch their careers.

Interns work in the office of a Member of Parliament for ten months. Since the Program was re-established in 2017, twelve interns have been welcomed to Ottawa. The Paul Yuzyk Institute for Youth Leadership provides training to the interns. We are grateful to the many generous organizations and individuals whose support makes the program possible.

Expert Insights Webinar Series

The Expert Insights program is a series of Ukrainian-language webinars on important topics that help Ukrainians who found refuge in Canada from the Russian genocidal war against Ukraine to adapt to life in Canada.



These webinars are useful to everyone who helps or works with Ukrainians who arrived in Canada as part of the Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET) program.

The Expert Insights program, supported by the Canada-Ukraine Foundation is available at no cost to anyone who wants to participate in it.

The webinar series began in September 2023 and occurred bi-weekly until June 2024. The live webinars were recorded and are available on the UCC's YouTube channel.

Highlights of Activities and Accomplishments 2022-2025

Service Canada webinars

In 2024 and 2025, the UCC and Service Canada partnered on a series of informational webinars on how to access government programs and services. Attendance and participation were free of charge.



Hromada Portal

Launched in 2025, the Hromada Portal is a comprehensive online directory designed to connect people with Ukrainian-Canadian businesses, community organizations, and support services across the country. The Hromada Portal is designed to connect and empower our vibrant community from coast to coast to coast.



UCC National Foundation

In the past three years the world of fundraising has changed a great deal. Governance obligations for charities and the expectations of donors have increased.

In response to these expectations, we established the **UCC National Foundation**, the new charitable arm of the **Ukrainian Canadian Congress**, which will respond to emerging issues and will focus on donor engagement, endowment management and governance.

This new entity will support the long-term sustainability and development of the Ukrainian Canadian community by funding initiatives that promote:

- **Community development**
- **Human Rights**
- **Education**
- **Youth engagement**

The work of the UCC National Foundation will begin in the new year and will transition with the UCC Charitable & Educational Trust and its Trustees.
